RITE OF INSTALLATION

P The following persons, having been elected by the congregation to positions of leadership, are asked to come forward as their offices and names are read.

The offices and names of those to be installed are read by a representative of the congregation. As their names are called, they come forward and stand before the minister.

The minister addresses those being installed.

P In Holy Baptism our Lord Jesus Christ liberated you from sin and death and made you members of his Church. Through Word and Sacrament you have been nurtured in faith. I ask you together with all who are here gathered, to confess the faith of the Church, the faith in which we are baptized.

The congregation STANDS and The Creed is said.

**All I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.**

**I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,
born of the virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried;
he descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again;
he ascended into heaven,
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,
and he will come to judge the living and the dead.**

**I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting. Amen.**

The congregation is seated. Those being installed stand and the minister addresses those being installed:

P Saint Paul writes: There are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit gives them. There are different ways of serving, but the same Lord is served. There are different abilities to perform service, but the same God gives to everyone ability for particular service. The Spirit's presence is shown in some way in each person, for the good of all.

You have been elected to positions of leadership and trust in this congregation.

You are to see that the words and deeds of this household of faith reflect him in whose name we gather.

You are to work together with other members to see that the worship and work of Christ are done in this congregation, and that God's will is done in this community and in the whole world.

You are to be diligent in your specific area of serving, that the one Lord who empowers you is glorified.

You are to be examples of faith active in love, to help maintain the life and harmony of this congregation.

On behalf of your sisters and brothers in Christ, I ask you:
Are you ready to accept and faithfully to carry out the duties of the offices to which you have been elected?

They respond: Yes, by the help of God.

Those being installed face the congregation. The minister addresses the congregation:

P People of God, I ask you: Will you support these, your elected leaders, and will you share in the mutual ministry Christ has given to all who are baptized?

All Yes, by the help of God.

Those being installed face the minister, who addresses them:

P I now declare you installed as council members of this congregation. God bless you with his Holy Spirit, that you may prove faithful servants of Christ.






